

# Parent Reminders

### **Parent-Teacher Conferences:** November 3<sup>rd</sup> 4:00-7:30 and November 9<sup>th</sup> 4:00-7:45 Our annual Parent-Teacher Conference evenings will be November 3<sup>rd</sup> & November 9<sup>th</sup>.

Meetings will be 15 minutes each.

Parent-Teacher Conferences will operate as follows and will be held either in-person or by Zoom or phone.

Elementary PreK-6: Please work directly with your child's teacher to set up times.

In your communication, please ensure to include the following:

1. Student(s) names(s) (first & last)

2. Which teacher(s) you would like to meet.

3. If you would like to have the meeting in-person or by phone.

4. The evening & time frame.

**5.** A valid, working contact phone number.

\*Please note that if a parent chooses to join via a phone call, know that the teacher

will phone the parent at the scheduled time.

Please be on time for your conference so the evening keeps moving and use only your allotted time.

If more time is needed, parents can schedule this separately with the teacher.

Also, please do not hesitate in any way to contact your child's teachers at any time by phone, e-mail or other means the teacher has set up.

#### **Reminder to Parents:**

It is **illegal** to pass a stopped school bus with its lights on EVEN in the school bus loop. Please park in the parking lot between 10:15-10:35 to avoid being stuck behind the Pre-K bus at drop off and pick up times.

### **Parent Volunteer Forms**

If you are interested in being a parent volunteer, or attending field trips with your child, you need to be approved by the Barker Board of Education.

When you have completed the application, we need you to bring it to the Elementary Office, with your Photo License/ID Card, so that we can Raptor you in and have your photo on the application.

Everyone that was previously approved is already on the list and will remain on the list until your child(ren) graduate.

### <u>Pratt Elementary is now using</u> <u>PickUp Patrol!</u>

We have phased out paper notes for bus changes and early dismissals. Parents are encouraged to set up an account from the PickUp Patrol emails that were sent out in September. If you have not received an email or if the link has expired, please contact Rachel Anderson at 716-795-3237, or email her at <u>randerson@barkercsd.net</u>, and she will send a new email.

We do ask that you continue to provide the address to where the child will be riding the bus to in the plan change notes space, along with the phone number for the adult at that address. If you need to know a bus number, feel free to call the Elementary Office. The cutoff time for changes is 1:00, we will not accept changes after this time.

We will <u>no longer</u> be accepting paper notes, phone calls or emails. We will only accept phone call changes in an extreme emergency.

For the Safety of our Students and Staff: All **Visitors MUST** report to the **Pratt Elementary Main Office** before going anywhere in the building. Please bring your License or Non-Driver ID card to sign in and receive a visitor pass and lanyard. Please sign out before leaving and return the lanyard and pass. Please **Check** with the Pratt Office First to make sure a Teacher is available to meet with you. **Thank You!** 

Morning Drop Off must be in the 1911 Building Parking Lot. Please do not park in the Elementary Lot in the morning, as we still have staff arriving at that time and the buses are pulling into and out of the bus loop.

### **Morning Drop Off**

Morning Drop off is from <u>7:50 - 8:00</u> in the <u>1911 Building Parking Lot</u> for the children that are being driven to school in the morning. Please adhere to this time frame. School begins at <u>8:00am</u>, and we need time for the children to make it to their classrooms for the start of the day. Any child that arrives after <u>8:00am</u> will be marked tardy. Late arrivals must be dropped off at and enter through the Pratt Elementary Main Entrance.

### Afternoon Pick Up

A reminder to parents that the Afternoon Pick Up time is from <u>2:35 - 2:45pm</u> in the <u>1911 Building Parking Lot</u>.

Please arrive during this time to pick your child(ren) up and have your Pick Up Tags ready. If the person that is picking your child up does not have a pickup tag, please notify us by using PickUp Patrol and make sure they bring an ID to show our Aide at dismissal. Thank you for providing transportation for your child(ren)!


